LIFT-OFF!

Thanks to the enormous generosity and support of this congregation, our new mission to provide weekend food to at least fifty students at Delaware School is off the ground! We needed \$2500 to join the national Blessings in a Backpack program and feed the fifty students for 19 weeks. We have raised \$3200 already and sent in the contract to become the first chapter in Syracuse.

To those who may not have heard of this mission before, it works like this. A person sponsors a student at Delaware School for \$100/year for 3 years by writing a check to Bellevue Church with Blessings in a Backpack on the memo line. Because we are part of the national Blessings in a Backpack group, they will send a Sysco truck to the church every two weeks with the exact food we need for the bags. Bellevue's job is to sort it into individual bags. Anyone can volunteer to help pack. A church member will deliver the fifty bags to Delaware on Thursday afternoon for distribution on Friday at dismissal time.

This program has been so successful that it is now feeding 83,000 elementary children in 46 states. Those students in the program report feeling supported by their community, learning better, and having fewer behavior problems.



We are off to a great start! Still, to keep our mission-rocket in the air for the last semester of this school year, we will need all the help we can get. See if your friends and neighbors can help.
