#### **BE PREPARED**

#### **BEFORE DISASTER STRIKES, TAKE THESE STEPS TO BE READY**

Disaster can strike anytime, anywhere. It's not just storms that threaten our safety and financial well-being. It could be a flood, earthquake, landslide, fire or even a home or office break-in.

#### WHAT YOU NEED IN AN EMERGENCY

Here's what the American Red Cross suggests that every household have on hand in case of an emergency or evacuation:

- Water: One gallon per person per day (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home)
- Food: Nonperishable, easy-to-prepare items (3-day supply for evacuation, 2-week supply for home)
- Flashlight (with extra batteries)
- Radio: Battery-powered or hand-crank
- First aid kit
- Medications: at least a 7-day supply of prescriptions
- Multi-purpose tool: Should include can opener, knife, etc.



- Personal hygiene items
- Personal documents: Copies of medications list, proof of address, mortgage or property deed, passports, birth certificates, insurance policies
- Cellphone (with chargers)
- Emergency contacts (Names of family members, insurers, etc.)
- Extra cash
- Emergency blanket
- Map(s) for local area, as well as designated family meeting spot in case of emergency
- Other: Baby care items, pet supplies, hearing-aid batteries, spare eyeglasses or contact lenses, extra car keys
- Emergency Financial First Aid Kit (EFFAK): Copies of your all your pertinent financial documents

# **Special Session of Annual Conference**

On Saturday, October 18<sup>th</sup>, 2014, members of the Upper New York Annual Conference voted to approve the Trustees' recommendation to purchase a 33,000-square foot building to serve as the new Conference Center at 7481 Henry Clay Boulevard, Liverpool, with an option to consider other properties should that purchase not work out. The vote authorized up to \$3.4 million be spent for the purchase and renovations. The move from the current Conference offices at University United Methodist Church is expected sometime in the fall of 2015.
